

RECOGNITION OF YOUR SKILLS

Make sure your skills are recognised



Being made redundant can be stressful – so can looking for employment.

Skill recognition is an important process for workers who are being made redundant as it can:

- Help you understand your strengths, weaknesses, and interests, and help you to map appropriate pathways for upskilling or reskilling.
- ✓ Improve employability by making sure your skills are recognised and can help you find new employment opportunities (when workers are made redundant, they may lack the skills or qualifications required in the current job market)
- igotimes Provide access to, and credit towards, further education and training.



What is it?

Recognition of Current Competencies (RCC) is a process that assesses your skills and competency—gained on the job, through formal learning, work experience, volunteering, self-directed learning and life experience—to determine if you meet the requirements for a unit of study.

Your RCC can be demonstrated in lots of different ways:

- Records of completed training
- Assessment records and examples
- ✓ Verification from your employer or supervisor
- Copies of your student records

Our Worker Assistance Coordinators are able to help to make sure your existing skills are formally recognised. You get to take those skills and formal recognition with you to your next job. This means you can demonstrate to prospective employers exactly what skills and competencies you hold.
